Functional Family Therapy (FFT): A Brief Summary of the Intervention

Description of the Intervention:

- Family-based prevention and intervention program that can be used as an alternative to out-of-home placement. Treatment focuses on family interactions, communications and problem-solving, parenting skills, and prosocial activities.
- ~ Delivered both in-home and in clinic settings as an outpatient therapy.
- ~ 8 to 12 one-hour sessions on average; up to 30 sessions of direct service for more difficult situations.
- ~ Length of treatment is approximately 3 months.
- Cost per youth is approximately \$5,000.

Target Population:

High risk youth ages 10-18 and their families, including:

- Youth exhibiting early and persistent antisocial behavior and/or violence.
- Youth who are using/abusing alcohol and/or other substances.
- ~ Youth who are at imminent risk of incarceration or other out-of-home placement.
- ~ Younger siblings of youth receiving intervention (prevention).

Primary Goals of the Intervention:

- Improve youth and family communication, interaction, and problem-solving.
- Increase utilization of outside system resources.
- ~ Increase effective parenting.
- Improve relationships with teachers and youth's commitment to school.
- ~ Promote involvement with positive peers and activities.
- ~ Reduce antisocial behavior, including association with delinquent and/or aggressive peers and involvement in criminal activities, including violent acts, substance use, and/or drug dealing.

Research Highlights:

- ~ FFT prevents and/or reduces substance abuse and delinquency.
- ~ FFT significantly reduces recidivism for a wide range of juvenile offenders.
- ~ FFT reduces the rate of targeted youth entering the adult corrections system and the number of siblings entering the juvenile justice system.
