

- Services Provided Consistent w/Comprehensive Plan to Prepare Youth in OHP for Independence [CFSR]
- 90% of children 12 and over participated in placement decisions [CFSR]
- Each child in OHP must receive timely periodic EPSDT exams and all other appropriate preventive health assessments & examinations Each child in OHP must receive all needed health services timely consistent with COMAR
